Enrollment Procedures and Processing

Dear perspective Elohim Student

The first initial step to choosing a program of study is to complete the enrollment application process. This process consists of:

- 1–3-page salvation experience writing
- Submit three-character letters.
- Submit proof of High school Diploma/GED and or college level work.
- Fill out and complete enrollment/evaluation form.

Note: It is very important to list the education you've completed, this includes non-traditional Sources such as seminars, on the job training, how long you've worked in a career field, course test out, certificates of achievement or completion, Sunday School teaching and church leadership events.

Building Student Transcript

At this point we will outline the process used by this institution in order to build your transcript, Determine needed course work and your qualifications for ministerial credentials.

Step 1: to evaluate a perspective student's Christian experience will be based in part on information from their 1–3-page salvation and conversion experience writing and the three character references. One reference needs to be from his/her pastor.

Step 2: To determine how many credit hours a perspective student has. This will depend on where he/she is in their education. Such as, have 128 hours been completed at the undergraduate level? Does the perspective student's current undergraduate degree have a minimum of 30 religious/biblical credit hours? Up to 90 credit hours can transfer from previous credit hours earned at a recognized institution.

Step 3: The student who desires to enroll into a counseling program at Elohim Bible College & Seminary, will be required to obtain ministerial credentials. Elohim will set the professional counselor candidate aside to the ministry of counseling once he/she has successfully met all the academic and other necessary requirements. Active pastors in good standing are exempt from the set aside requirement.

Step 4: Once student completes all initial requirements as stated above to include completely filling out enrollment/evaluation form and send the requested information to this school along with a onetime non-refundable processing fee of \$100.00. Elohim will process the student's application and based on information provided, credit hours will be officially assigned, and approval granted for enrollment into selected degree program. Approval is predicated on the fact that all initial processing requirements have been met.

Down Payment

Once the applicant has received approval from Elohim the student must send his or her down payment of \$100.00 along with signed agreement to make monthly acceptable installments to this institution. Make checks or money orders payable to:

Mode of Meetings

The student is to coordinate with his or her supervisor in order to establish a mutually agreed upon schedule of study. The schedule of study denotes a time that has been selected as workable for both the supervisor and student. This will constitute a regularly established hour of supervised meetings on a selected day (usually Monday – Thursday) for a minimum of twice a month or as the supervisor deems necessary.

The student may meet the supervisor in person, approved phone conference, internet/e-mail, audio cassette, video tapes or DVD for hours of instruction. The focus is to be flexible as long as the supervisor is informed and agrees.

At no time will any Elohim students or supervisor meet after normal school/scheduled class hours.

Credit System

Elohim Bible College & Seminary operates under a semester system. The unit for counting credits is the semester hour.

Course Completion Date

Elohim's average time to complete a selected degree program is two to three academic years depending on where the mature adult is in their stage of learning.

Each student needs to know the specific time limit for his or her degree program.

Grade Appeal Process

If a student feels there is an error on his or her grade report, he or she must begin the appeal process within thirty days of receiving the grade report. After 30 days the grade is considered final and is not subject to appeal by the student or any third party.

Dropping/Adding Courses

Course Repeating Policy

Students desiring to repeat a course for the purpose of having the first grade removed the cumulative grade point average must follow these procedures:

- 1) A course may be repeated once at no additional charge if a student receives a grade of "C" or less.
- 2) A course may be repeated for an additional charge if the student receives a grade of "B" or higher.
- 3) The second grade, in all circumstances, replaces the first grade for the purpose of calculating the grade point average. Any student receiving an "F" or "I" must contact the grade department for further instructions. No student will be allowed to graduate with an "F" or "I" in a required course. Any undergraduate student receiving two "F" s will be placed on academic probation. Any graduate student receiving one "F" will be placed on academic probation.

Note: Students are required to receive a B or higher on all course work assigned.

Course Selection

If a student has completed a course that is required in his or her program of study prior to enrollment into an Elohim Bible College & Seminary program, the Elohim Bible College & Seminary student may request a change of course. The student must have a grade of "C" or better on the previous completed course, and the course must have been offered on the same level (i.e. Bachelor, Master) as the required Elohim Bible College & Seminary course. Elohim Bible College & Seminary reserves the right to require any course regardless of student's previous education.

Graduation Requirements

Bachelor's degree – Requires the completion of 128 semester hours. The master's degree hours are determined per selected program but a minimum of 30 semester hours are required.
